Social and Economic Justice

March 22, 2003 (Saturday, 9:30 am – 3:30 pm; RELX 862.01)



Catholic social teaching has been called the Church's "best kept secret." This workshop will examine the Church's social tradition and teaching by looking at the roots of that tradition and its implications in the social and political arena. We will draw primarily from those documents that address issues of social and economic justice such as the papal encyclical *Rerum Novarum* and the U.S. Bishops' pastoral letter on the economy, *Economic Justice for All*.

Teaching on War, Violence & Peace

April 5, 2003 (Saturday, 9:30 am – 3:30 pm; RELX 862.02)

Catholic social teaching develops as the Church reflects on issues and situations we confront in the world. Statements on war and peace raise fundamental questions of how we, as people of faith, respond in an increasingly violent society. This workshop will draw primarily from those documents that address issues of war, violence and peace such as *The Challenge of Peace*, *The Harvest of Justice is Sown in Peace*, and selected documents by the Vatican and the U.S. bishops on war, the death penalty, and related issues.



Thomas A. Chabolla was the longtime director of the Office for Justice and Peace, the Campaign for Human Development, Catholic Relief Services, and the Secretariat for Pastoral and Community Services of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Location: Both workshops will be held at Loyola Marymount University, in St. Robert's Hall 353.

Cost: \$50 per day (each workshop earns 0.5 semester hours of Continuing Education Credit).
